Dear Secretary of State,

This month, the Government launched the Community Organisations Cost of Living Fund worth £76 million, to provide support for those organisations at the coalface of the cost of living crisis, so that they can support those most affected by the crisis. We welcome this intervention, but we note with dismay that the proportion of that fund due to Northern Ireland via the Barnett Formula, which would ordinarily go to the Executive to spend, is not expected to reach those most in need, as it will in England, Scotland and Wales.

We are aware that, while announcing the 2023/24 Budget in April of this year, you indicated that any in-year increases to the block grant would be allocated towards paying off the outstanding balance of overspend from previous years. We appeal to you to make an exception in these circumstances and to allow this grant to be used for its intended purpose.

The cost of living crisis is causing hunger, cold and stress all over the UK, and Northern Ireland is no different in that regard. We have the highest uptake of Universal Credit and equivalent legacy benefits in the UK, higher prevalence of mental health problems, and more people cutting back on essentials than anywhere else in the UK. Yet again, however, we are asked to suffer more than is needed, for longer than is needed, while others are given relief. To

exacerbate the problem, some of the organisations that stand in the gap here are struggling so badly that they may soon collapse, leaving people in even deeper crisis. The Government clearly recognise that this situation merits intervention, and that is true in Northern Ireland as well as in Great Britain.

Whatever the reasons for previous overspending, whatever the reasons for political deadlock, we cannot allow the most vulnerable people in Northern Ireland - who had no part in creating the crisis - to suffer for these circumstances. The amount of money associated with this grant will not make a significant dent in the debt accrued, but it would make a significant difference in local communities.

We urge you to use the additional monies from Westminster to alleviate some of the worst effects of the cost-of-living crisis. We are available to meet to further discuss the difference this additional funding would make for the most vulnerable in Northern Ireland, and we hope you make the right decision to improve lives in Northern Ireland, not worsen them.
